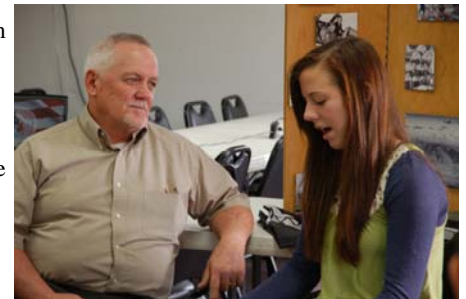

Scholarship Deadline March 15th

High school seniors, don't miss the deadline for submitting your 500-word essay to the Veterans Heritage Project scholarship committee no later than March 15th at 11:59PM.

"The purpose of these awards is to recognize and assist certain students who have exhibited extraordinary qualities while working with veterans, the project, and the publication of the book," says VHP scholarship committee chairman Dick Doubek. The amount of the two scholarships is \$500 and \$250, respectively. Those eligible must be a senior,

have active membership in VHP in 2010, have two years of participation in VHP, and be eligible for full-time undergraduate admission to an accredited four-year college or university, two-year college or trade school. All branches of the U.S. Military are also included for the award.

The VHP Scholarship application must include a 500-word open-ended essay telling your experience with VHP. Please submit your typewritten essay to Dick at azcarboy@cox.net. Good luck!

White Out—Reflections on a Deadline

I admit it. I am a slave to my spreadsheet. Listed thereon are the names of the 57 veterans we interviewed for Volume 7 of *Since You Asked: Arizona Veterans Share Their Memories*, as well as whether we have their pictures, biography, forms, and other information for the book. The date the student submits the essay is recorded, the date it is sent to the veteran, when it is returned, and a big bold X for final completion.

To highlight outstanding items, I have taken to filling in Excel boxes with yellow. I don't know why yellow became the *co-leur de choix*, perhaps because I can see the X behind it. But while looking at the big picture, all those yellow boxes tell the students what needs to be done. As we ap-

proach our deadline, I take great delight in returning a highlighted box to its original white and adding whatever X or date completes the mission. Yesterday I found myself gleefully reverting the yellow boxes to white,

A few students moved their chairs a few feet farther across the room while others buried their noses in another project, pretending they hadn't heard the ravings of this clearly overworked, stressed advisor.

\$1500 Price Break at Color House

VHP turns once again to Color House Graphics to produce its 7th Volume of *Since You Asked*. "With an eye on the future, we were able to get a price break of about \$1,500 this year. That's significant," remarked Dick Doubek, VHP's Treasurer. Color House recognizes the value of loyal customers, especially given

The Value of “Pilot” School Feedback

This March, chapter advisors from VHP Pilot Schools will be meeting to provide VHP with critical feedback on what works—and what doesn’t—in establishing, carrying out, and financing VHP programs at high schools and, potentially, middle schools across Arizona. Advisors to the non-profit suggested early on using pilot schools as means to experience and learn what it takes to roll out a student club dedicated to capturing and recording veterans’ stories. It sounds easy to do — listen to veterans, then write an essay, but the level of effort needed to successfully orchestrate a group of students within

a school, let alone the collection and publication of stories across multiple schools, is very complex. VHP’s job is to find out how to best streamline and make it easy for new Chapter Advisors to take on a project in their schools. That means listening to pilot school advisors, analyzing every detail of their experience, and developing easy processes and new training on the most expeditious techniques for making the program a success for advisors, students and veterans.
